

THE DISTRICT OF HUNTINGDONSHIRE

(OFF-STREET PARKING PLACES) ORDER 2005

The Huntingdonshire District Council in exercise of their powers under Sections 32 and 35(1) and (3) of the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984 ("the Act") and of Part IV of Schedule 9 of the Act and of all other enabling powers, and following the consent of the Cambridgeshire County Council in accordance with Section 39(3) of the Act and after consultation with the Chief Officer of Police in accordance with Part III of Schedule 9 to the Act, hereby make the following Order:-

PART I

GENERAL

1. This Order shall come into operation on 1st June 2005 and may be cited as "The District of Huntingdonshire (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 2005".

2. (1) Any reference in this Order to a numbered Article is a reference to the Article bearing that number in this Order, and any reference in this Order to "the First Schedule" and "the Second Schedule" is a reference to the First and Second Schedule respectively to this Order.

(2) In this Order, unless the context otherwise requires:

"the Council" means Huntingdonshire District Council;

"the County Council" means Cambridgeshire County Council;

"barrier machine" means an apparatus or device of a type approved by the appropriate Minister pursuant to Section 51(2)(d) of the Act and the provisions of Section 52 of the Act shall apply in respect of such apparatus;

"charging hours" means any period specified in paragraph 3 of the First Schedule in respect of which a charge is specified in Article 4 ;

"disabled person's badge" has the same meaning as the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) Regulations 1982 as amended by the Disabled Persons (Badges for Motor Vehicles) (Amendment) Regulations 1992;

"driver" in relation to a vehicle waiting in a parking place means the person driving the vehicle at the time it was left in the parking place;

"fixed charge parking place" means those parking places specified by name in sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule and shown on the plans attached to this Order;

"owner" in relation to a vehicle, means the person by whom such vehicle is kept and used;

"parking attendant" means a person authorised by or on behalf of the Council to supervise any parking place;

"parking bay" means any area of a parking place which is provided for the leaving of a vehicle and indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place;

"parking place" means any area of land specified by name in sub-paragraphs (i) or (ii) of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule provided by the Council under Section 32(1) of the Act for use as a parking place;

"resident" means a person whose usual place of abode is at premises the postal address of which is in any street or part of a street described in Column (b) of the Second Schedule and such a person is a resident for the purposes of the corresponding parking place named in Column (a) of that Schedule;

"resident's parking ticket" means a ticket issued in accordance with the provisions of this Order to a resident for the parking of a vehicle in the corresponding parking places named in Column (a) of the Second Schedule and for use in those parking places only;

"season parking ticket" means a ticket issued in accordance with the provisions of this Order to a person for the parking of a vehicle in a parking place equipped with one or more ticket machines and for use in those parking places only;

"season parking ticket holder" means a person who has purchased a season parking ticket from the District Council;

"staff" means a member of staff nominated by the County Council to park a vehicle in the Library (Inner Section) Car Park, Huntingdon;

"staff parking ticket" means a ticket issued in accordance with the provisions of this Order to staff in the Library (Inner Section) Car Park, Huntingdon;

"ticket machine" means an apparatus or device of a type and design approved by the appropriate Minister pursuant to Section 51(2)(d) of the Act and the provisions of Section 52 of the Act shall apply in respect of such apparatus;

"user" means a person attending the Priory Centre, St Neots and authorised by the Town Council to park in the Priory Car Park, St Neots

"variable charge parking place" means those parking places specified by name in sub-paragraphs (i) and (ii) of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule and shown on the plans attached to this Order;

"vehicle" means a vehicle described in paragraph 2 of the First Schedule.

PART II

USE OF PARKING PLACE

Use of Land and Parking Place

3. (1) Each area of land specified by name in paragraph 1 of the First Schedule and delineated on the relevant plan appended to this Order may be used, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such classes of vehicles, in such positions, on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that area in the First Schedule.
- (2) Each area of land specified by name in sub-paragraph (iv) of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule and delineated on the relevant plan appended to this Order may be used only by holders of disabled person's badges, subject to the following provisions of this Order, as a parking place for such classes of vehicles, in such positions, on such days and during such hours as are specified in relation to that area in the First Schedule.
- (3) Where in the First Schedule a parking place is described as available for vehicles of a specified class or in a specified position, the driver of a vehicle shall not permit it to wait in that parking place unless it is of the class and in the position so specified.
- (4) Where parking bays are provided then the driver of a vehicle shall park the vehicle properly in the marked parking bay and not in such a position as to cause an obstruction.
- (5) A driver of a vehicle upon which a disabled person's badge is not displayed shall not park the vehicle in a parking bay which is indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place as for use by the driver of a vehicle upon which a disabled person's badge is displayed.
- (6) Where loading bays are designated by adjacent signage, a vehicle shall not be left longer than the time designated.
- (7) Insofar as a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours the driver thereof shall pay such charge or charges as are specified in the following provisions of this Order.
- (8) No person shall park a vehicle in the Library (Inner Section) car park, Huntingdon from 7.00 a.m. to 6.00 p.m. from Mondays to Fridays (except where these fall on Public Bank Holidays) except in accordance with Article 32 of this Order.

Amount of Charge at Parking Places

4. (1) The charge for a vehicle left in a variable charge parking place during the charging hours specified in sub-paragraphs (i) and (ii) of paragraph 3 of the First Schedule shall be in accordance with sub-paragraphs (i) and (ii) of paragraph 5 of that Schedule.
- (2) The charge for a vehicle left in a fixed charge parking place during the charging hours specified in sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph 3 of the First Schedule shall be in accordance with sub-paragraphs (iii) of paragraph 5 of that Schedule.
- (3) If the parking place is equipped with a barrier machine the charge referred to in paragraph (2) of this Article shall be payable by the insertion of the appropriate coin or coins into the barrier machine, provided that in the event of a mechanical or electrical failure or other failure of a barrier machine a parking attendant may collect the charge and the parking attendant shall issue a ticket therefor.
- (4) If the parking place is equipped with one or more ticket machines, the charges referred to in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Article shall be payable by the insertion of the appropriate coin or coins into the ticket machine, provided that in the event of a mechanical or electrical failure or other failure of a ticket machine a parking attendant may collect the charge and the parking attendant shall issue a ticket therefor.
- (5) Any ticket issued on payment of the charges referred to in paragraphs (1) and (2) of this Article shall be so exhibited on the vehicle as to be clearly and easily visible, and
 - (a) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front glass windscreen immediately behind the windscreen; and
 - (b) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front glass windscreen in a conspicuous position on the front near side of the vehicle.
- (6) The ticket or tickets shall be so exhibited on the vehicle that the time shown on the front of the said ticket or tickets is clearly and easily visible.
- (7) The owner of a vehicle may on application to the Council purchase a season parking ticket in respect of that vehicle for a charge ascertained by reference to the charge specified in sub-paragraph (iv) of paragraph 5 of the First Schedule and that season parking ticket shall be valid in a parking place as specified in the Second Schedule in accordance with Article 29 of this Order.
- (8) If the driver of any vehicle parking in a parking place is the holder of a current season parking ticket, he shall exhibit that ticket on the vehicle in the manner described in paragraph (5) of this Article.

- (9) Any person who avoids or seeks to avoid, or assists in avoiding the payment of the charge specified in this Article shall be guilty of an offence under this Order.
- (10) If at any time while a vehicle is left in a parking place no ticket or tickets is or are exhibited on that vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Article it shall be presumed unless the contrary is proved that the charge as specified in this Article has not been duly paid for the vehicle and that the initial period for which payment was made by the charge has already expired.
- (11) A vehicle shall leave the parking place by the time the purchased ticket expires and may not return to that parking place within one hour of leaving. Blue Badge holders using the parking places specified in sub-paragraph (iv) of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule, may not return within one hour of their initial three hour period.

Amount of Excess Charge at Parking Places and Payment

- 5. (1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place during the charging hours and the charge referred to in paragraph (1) of Article 4 in respect of variable charge parking places or paragraph (2) of Article 4 in respect of fixed charge parking places has not been paid or it has been left in any parking place for longer than the period for which payment was made, then the amount specified in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph 6 of the First Schedule (which amount is hereinafter referred to as the "excess charge") shall be payable.
- (2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which an excess charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a parking attendant to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars:-
 - (a) the registration mark of the vehicle or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
 - (b) the time at which he first observed that the initial period for which payment was made had expired;
 - (c) a statement that the excess charge is required to be paid;
 - (d) the manner in which, and the time within which, the excess charge should be paid; and
 - (e) a statement that it is an offence under Section 35(A) of the Act for the driver of a vehicle who has left the vehicle in a parking place to fail to pay the excess charge.
- 6. An excess charge shall be paid to the Director of Commerce and Technology of the Council at Pathfinder House, St Mary's Street, Huntingdon, PE29 3TN.

7. If an excess charge is paid so as to reach the said Director of Commerce and Technology not later than 4.30 pm on the 14th day following the day on which the excess charge was incurred, the amount of the said excess charge shall be reduced to the charge specified in sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph 6 of the First Schedule.

Provided that if the said 14th day falls upon a day on which the Directorate of the said Director is closed, the period within which payment of the said charge shall be made to the Council shall be extended until 4.30 pm on the next full day on which the said Directorate is open.

8. Where, in any proceedings for an offence under this Order of failing to pay the charge or the excess charge or both of them, it is proved that the amount which has become due, or any part of that amount, has not been duly paid, a Court may order the payment of the sum not paid, and any sum ordered to be paid by virtue of this Article shall be recoverable as a penalty.

Restriction on removal of notices or tickets

9. (1) When a notice has been attached to a vehicle in accordance with any of the foregoing provisions of this Order no person other than the person authorised by the Council in that behalf or the driver or person authorised by the driver in that behalf shall remove the notice from the vehicle.
(2) When a ticket or tickets have been exhibited on a vehicle in accordance with the provisions of this Order no person not being the driver of the vehicle shall remove the ticket or tickets from the vehicle unless authorised to do so by the driver.

Other Provisions

10. The driver of a vehicle shall not permit that vehicle to wait in a parking place unless the vehicle is licensed in pursuance of the provisions of the Vehicle Excise and Registration Act 1994 and unless there is in relation to the use of the vehicle by the driver such a policy of insurance as complies with the requirements of Part VI of the Road Traffic Act 1988.
11. The driver of a motor vehicle using a parking place shall stop the engine as soon as the vehicle is in position in the parking place and shall not start the engine except when about to change the position of the vehicle in or to depart from the parking place.
12. (1) No person shall within a parking place, without the prior approval of the Council given in writing sell or attempt to sell any article to persons in or near the parking place or sell or offer for hire his skill or services and shall not use a vehicle or part of a parking place for such a purpose or for the purpose of any exhibition and no vehicle shall be advertised for sale while it is standing in a parking place.
(2) No person shall use any part of a parking place or any vehicle left in a parking place or anything towed by a vehicle:

- (a) for residing or sleeping or camping or cooking; or
 - (b) for the purpose of servicing maintenance repairing or washing any vehicle or part thereof other than as reasonably necessary to enable that vehicle to depart from the parking place.
- (3) No person shall transfer a ticket purchased for one vehicle to be used on another vehicle.
13. (1) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in a position other than in accordance with the provisions of Article 3 a person authorised by the Council in that behalf may alter or cause to be altered the position of the vehicle so that its position is in accordance with the said provisions.
- (2) If a vehicle is left in a parking place in contravention of any of the provisions of this Order a person authorised by the Council in that behalf may remove the vehicle from that parking place or arrange for such removal.
- (3) For the purpose of meeting the requirements of an emergency a person authorised in that behalf by the Council or a Police Constable in uniform may alter or cause to be altered the position of a vehicle in a parking place or remove or arrange for the removal of a vehicle from that parking place.
- (4) Any person altering or causing the alteration of the position of a vehicle by virtue of paragraph (1) of this Article or removing or causing the removal of a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs (2) or (3) of this Article may do so by towing or driving the vehicle or in such other manner as he may think reasonably necessary to enable the position of the vehicle to be altered or the vehicle to be removed.
- (5) Any person removing or arranging for the removal of a vehicle by virtue of paragraphs (2) and (3) of this Article shall make such arrangements as he considers to be reasonably necessary for the safety of the vehicle in the place to which it is removed.
14. (1) The driver of any vehicle in a parking place shall comply with any reasonable instructions given by a parking attendant or other duly authorised person.
- (2) Where in a parking place signs are erected or surface markings are laid for the purpose of:
- (a) indicating the entrance to or exit from the parking place; or
 - (b) indicating that a vehicle using the parking place shall proceed in a specified direction within the parking place
- no person shall drive or permit to be driven any vehicle:

- (i) so that it enters the parking place otherwise than by an entrance or leaves the parking place otherwise than by an exit so indicated; or
 - (ii) in a direction other than so specified.
- 15. No person shall except with the permission of a person authorised by the Council in that behalf drive or permit to be driven any vehicle in a parking place for any purpose other than the purpose of leaving that vehicle in the parking place in accordance with the provisions of this Order or for the purpose of departing from the parking place.
- 16. Any person who wilfully or recklessly damages in any way or interferes with the fabric or structure or equipment of any parking place shall be guilty of an offence under this Order and in addition to the penalty provided by the Act shall be liable for the cost of repair of the damage.
- 17. No person shall use any parking place for the playing of any game nor shall any pedal cycles be taken or ridden therein except where specific provision is made for the storage of pedal cycles.
- 18.
 - (1) Where the driver of a vehicle is alleged to be guilty of an offence to which this Order applies the owner of the vehicle shall give such information as to the identity of the driver as he may be required to give by or on behalf of the Council; and
 - (2) Any other person shall if required give any information which it is in his power to give that may lead to the identification of the driver.
- 19. Notwithstanding the provisions of this Order the Council may by notice displayed on or near a parking place:
 - (a) close that parking place for any period; or
 - (b) prohibit the entry of vehicles on to the parking place for any period either generally or in respect of a particular class or classes of vehicle and the driver of any vehicle or of a particular class or classes of vehicle shall not enter the parking place when entry has been so prohibited.
- 20. There shall be on or near each variable charge parking place at least one ticket machine.
- 21. No person shall cause or take part in any gathering or demonstration within a parking place or cause any unreasonable or unnecessary noise.
- 22. No person shall within any parking place commit any act which if committed on a public highway would constitute an offence under the provisions of the Environmental Protection Act 1990.
- 23. The Council shall not be responsible for any loss or damage to any vehicle or to anything therein or thereon from any cause whatsoever whilst entering within or leaving a parking place.

Penalty Charges at Parking Places and Payment

24. (1) If an offence is carried out as detailed in Articles 3(2), 3(3), 3(4), 3(5), 4(11), 10, 11, 12(1), 12(2), or 15 then the amount specified in sub-paragraph (i) of paragraph 7 of the First Schedule (which amount is hereinafter referred to as the "penalty charge") shall be payable.
- (2) In the case of a vehicle in respect of which a penalty charge may have been incurred, it shall be the duty of a parking attendant to attach to the vehicle in a conspicuous position a notice which shall include the following particulars:-
- (a) the registration mark of the vehicle or, where the vehicle is being used under a trade licence, the number of the trade plate carried by the vehicle;
 - (b) the time at which he first observed the offence to have been carried out;
 - (c) a statement as to which Article the penalty charge is required to be paid;
 - (d) the manner in which, and the time within which, the penalty charge should be paid; and
 - (e) a statement that it is an offence under Section 35(A) of the Act for the driver of a vehicle who has left the vehicle in a parking place to fail to pay the penalty charge.
25. An penalty charge shall be paid to the Director of Commerce and Technology of the Council at Pathfinder House, St Mary's Street, Huntingdon.
26. If a penalty charge is paid so as to reach the said Director of Commerce and Technology not later than 4.30 pm on the 14th day following the day on which the penalty charge was incurred, the amount of the said penalty charge shall be reduced to the charge specified in sub-paragraph (ii) of paragraph 7 of the First Schedule.

Provided that if the said 14th day falls upon a day on which the Directorate of the said Director is closed, the period within which payment of the said charge shall be made to the Council shall be extended until 4.30 pm on the next full day on which the said Directorate is open.

27. Where, in any proceedings for an offence under this Order of failing to pay the penalty charge, it is proved that the amount which has become due, or any part of that amount, has not been duly paid, a Court may order the payment of the sum not paid, and any sum ordered to be paid by virtue of this Article shall be recoverable as a penalty.

PART III

EXEMPTION

28. (1) The driver of a vehicle who is entitled to display and the vehicle which does display in the relevant position a disabled person's badge shall be exempt from any payment specified in Article 4 of this Order for those car parks specified in sub-paragraphs (i), (ii) and (iv) of paragraph 1 of the First Schedule and exempt from any limitation of time specified in Article 3 and for those car parks specified in the First Schedule sections 1(i) and 1(ii)
- (2) For the purpose of this Order a vehicle shall be regarded as displaying a disabled person's badge in the relevant position when:
- (a) for disabled badges issued prior to 2nd March 1992:
- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited thereon on the near side of and immediately behind the windscreen and with its front facing forward so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so as to be legible from outside the vehicle; and
- (b) for disabled badges issued on or after 2nd March 1992:
- (i) in the case of a vehicle fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited thereon so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle; or
- (ii) in the case of a vehicle not fitted with a front windscreen the badge is exhibited in a conspicuous position on the vehicle so that Part 1 of the badge is legible from outside the vehicle.
29. (1) A resident of premises identified in column (b) of the Second Schedule who displays a resident's parking ticket in the manner indicated in paragraph (5) of Article 4 shall be exempt from any limitations of time specified in Article 3 and from any payment specified in Article 4 in so far as the vehicle is parked in a parking place for which the resident's parking ticket is valid. This does not exempt the resident from any other restrictions set out in the Order.
- (2) A resident's parking ticket may be obtained from the Council subject to a limit of one per household upon the applicant showing that:
- (a) s/he is a resident;

- (b) the premises have been constructed prior to 31st March 1998 and have not in the past had any provision for the parking of a motor vehicle defined in paragraph 2 of the First Schedule within the curtilage of the premises and there are on street parking restrictions on the adjoining highway;
 - (c) the vehicle is one defined in paragraph 2 of the First Schedule;
 - (d) s/he is the owner of the vehicle; and
 - (e) at the time of the application Article 10 has been complied with.
- (3) A resident's parking ticket shall state:
- (a) the vehicle's registration number;
 - (b) the make of the vehicle;
 - (c) the date of expiry of the ticket; and
 - (d) the name of the parking place.
- (4) A resident's parking ticket shall cease to have validity upon the happening of any one of the following events:
- (a) the owner ceases to be a resident;
 - (b) failure to comply with Article 10 hereof; or
 - (c) the expiry thereof.
30. (1) The driver of a vehicle who displays a season parking ticket in the manner indicated in paragraph (5) of Article 4 shall be exempt from any limitations of time specified in Article 3 insofar as the vehicle is parked in a parking place as detailed in the Third Schedule and within the specific town for which it is purchased.
- (2) A season parking ticket may be obtained from the Council upon the applicant showing that:
- (a) he/she is a resident or has a place of permanent employment within the town for which the season parking ticket has been applied for;
 - (b) the vehicle is one defined in paragraph 2 of the First Schedule;
 - (c) s/he is the owner of the vehicle; and
 - (d) at the time of the application Article 10 has been complied with.
- (3) A season parking ticket shall state:

- (a) the town for which it is issued;
 - (b) the registration number of the vehicle;
 - (c) the make of vehicle; and
 - (d) the date of expiry of the ticket.
- (4) A season parking ticket shall cease to have validity upon the happening of any one of the following events:
- (a) the vehicle is sold by the owner by whom the season parking ticket was purchased;
 - (b) failure to comply with Article 10 hereof; and
 - (c) the expiry thereof.
 - (d) the applicant ceases to be a resident of that town or terminates employment in that town
31. Any motorcycle which is parked within a marked parking bay which is indicated by markings on the surface of the parking place as for use by a motorcycle shall be exempt from any payment specified in Article 4 of this Order but must not exceed the maximum time allowed for that parking place.
32. (1) Staff who display a staff parking ticket in the manner indicated in paragraph (5) of Article 4 shall be exempt from any limitations of time specified in Article 3 and from any payment specified in Article 4 insofar as the vehicle is parked in the Library car park (Inner Section), Huntingdon.
- (2) A staff parking ticket may be obtained from the County Council upon the applicant showing that:
- (a) he is a member of staff employed by the County Council;
 - (b) the vehicle is one defined in paragraph 2 of the First Schedule; and
 - (c) at the time of the application Article 10 has been complied with.
33. (1) A User who displays a user's ticket in the manner indicated in paragraph (6) of Article 4 shall be exempt from any payment specified in article 4 insofar as the vehicle is parked in Priory car park, St Neots.
- (2) A user's parking ticket may be obtained from the Town Council upon the applicant showing that:

- (a) s/he is a user:
 - (b) the vehicle is one defined in paragraph 2 of the First Schedule;
 - (c) at the time of the application Article 10 has been complied with.
- (3) A user's ticket shall state:
- (a) the date and time of issue of the ticket; and
 - (b) the name of the parking place

PART IV

Disposal of vehicles abandoned in a Parking Place

33. The Council may as respects a vehicle which has been removed from a parking place in pursuance of Article 13 if it appears to them to have been abandoned sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle after having made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the name and address of the owner of the vehicle **provided that** the Council shall be deemed to have made reasonable enquiry to ascertain the name and address of the owner of any vehicle to which this Article applies if they have taken in relation to that vehicle such steps as may be prescribed by any Regulations for the time being in force by virtue of the Act for authorising the Council to sell or otherwise dispose of the vehicle as if it had been left on a road and if it appears to the Council that it had been abandoned.

PART V

Revocation

34. The following Orders are hereby revoked:-

The District of Huntingdonshire (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1996, The District of Huntingdonshire (Off-Street Parking Places) Order 1998, and The District of Huntingdonshire (Off-Street Parking Places) Orders (NO. 1) and (NO. 2) 2000.

- (b) Chequers Way (Disabled)

2. Classes of Vehicles

- (i) Motor cars within the provisions of Section 136(2)(a) of the Act.
- (ii) Motor cycles as defined in Section 136(4) of the Act.
- (iii) Motor vehicles constructed or adapted for use for the conveyance of goods or burden the unladen weight of which does not exceed 3.5 tonnes.
- (iv) Invalid carriages as defined in Section 136(5) of the Act.
- (v) Self propelled caravans as defined in Regulation 3(2) of the Motor Vehicles (Construction and Use) Regulations 1986.

3. **Charging Hours**

- (i) Variable charge parking places and fixed charge parking places, except Pathfinder House (St Mary's Street) and (High Street), Mill Common, St Germain St Minor and Library (Inner section) car parks, Huntingdon -

7.00 am to 6.00 pm on every day except Sunday and Christmas Day.

- (ii) Fixed and variable charge parking places at Pathfinder House (St Mary's Street) and (High Street), Castle Hill House (front section) and Library (Inner section) , Huntingdon -

7.00 am to 6.00 pm on Saturdays (except where this falls on Christmas Day) and Public Bank Holidays (except where these fall on a Sunday).

- (iii) Variable charge parking places Mill Common and St Germain St Minor car parks

8.10 am to 6.00 pm on every day except Sunday and Christmas Day.

4. **Maximum Waiting Period**
